KATHY'S NEW ROLE - QUALITY AND TRAINING COORDINATOR

Kathy Williams has been appointed as our new Training and Quality Coordinator. Kathy will provide face-to-face training for staff on the floor as well as ensuring the Home is compliant and meeting all Aged Care Quality Standards. Kathy will be conducting internal audits and assisting with the collection of data for the National Aged Care Mandatory Quality Indicator Program. The Government has recently added six quality indicators on which we are required to report on a quarterly basis, bringing the total to eleven quality indicators. These are pressure injuries, physical restraint, unplanned weight loss, falls and major injury, medication management, activities of daily living, incontinence care, hospitalisation, workforce, consumer experience and quality of life.

NEW SWIPE CARD ACCESS

As a result of a Safer Communities Grant, Maurice Zeffert has been able to install a new swipe card system. The previous system was so outdated that the parts were obsolete and the system kept failing. Users can access doors with an app on their phone, and do not have to worry about remembering their swipe card. The Home is also in the process of having cameras and extra lighting installed as part of the grant. All these measures ensure our residents stay safe and can live peacefully at the home.
