Mazeltov, Dulcie. We wish you continuing love and joy.










ELI KITAY IS 100 YEARS OLD!



'Well, I'm an old man', but I'm not that bad.' So said Eli Kitay at the age of 91, as reported in The West Australian on 15 February 2015 in an article by Liam Croy entitled Nonagenarian still setting records.*

And Eli is still 'not that bad.' In fact, he is very good! He recently celebrated his 100th birthday with family and friends from around the world, enjoying the fact that he had reached such a wonderful milestone and is still moving, swimming, taking a keen interest in world events and his family as well as reflecting, thinking and 'getting wiser'.

Eli is a lifelong learner, keeping up with world events and what is going on in the community and in his family. He developed a love of running and swimming while at school and after taking a break from both whilst in the working and raising a family phase of his life, returned to both in his later years. He was running up to fifty kilometres at the age of seventy, 'never at the back, always in the middle of the pack.' In swimming, he holds the 200 m, 800 m and 1500 m Australian Masters freestyle records for the 90-94 age group.

Eli's ancestors are not long-living so he is still amazed that he has reached this milestone. He has been reflecting on his life and the ethos he follows - keeping body and mind alive by moving, not sitting, and doing things like Wordle and Sudoku regularly – which is clearly a factor in his longevity and abilities.

Eli Kitay's active engagement in life is a motivation to all who aspire to age well.

ICARE

MZH has successfully implemented a fully integrated clinical system that is user-friendly and can be configured to meet specific needs. To achieve this, we adopted the Telstra Health Clinical Manager, Medication Manager, and CareKeeper as an integrated Clinical Management Software. The primary reason for the switch was to access the CareKeeper app, which allows care staff to quickly access care plans and complete tasks at the bedside using a mobile device. This eliminates the need to spend time at a care station and allows care staff to spend more time with residents. The implementation was completed successfully by the end of 2023.
